

The Secret Pasts of Clarkdale's Historic Buildings


Have you ever wondered who might have sat in your favorite seat at Main Street Café before you?


The building at 920 Main Street in Clarkdale began life as an ice cream parlor and bakery run by Karl Schott. The new establishment opened in September of 1915.

A newspaper article from the time described it as 'one of the most modern and up-to-date establishments in Arizona.'

The café included a soda fountain and candy store. A rest area with comfortable chairs and couches specifically for ladies was located in a balcony overlooking the soda fountain.

According to a report in the March 30, 1923 edition of the Verde Copper News, Mr. Schott eventually moved his business to Cottonwood.





The Elements of Architectural Character

Historical preservation focuses on retaining the small bits and pieces that create the overall look, or architectural character, of a place or building.

Clarkdale has an abundance of architectural features that contribute to the character of the Historic District. These include the brick-relief motifs and the clerestory windows along the commercial buildings on Main Street.

The homes within the district share wrought iron fences and open front porches. These elements contribute to the character of the small town that is Clarkdale.

These small features create a big impact to the historic feel of the original town site and are worth retaining.



News from the archives:

Preserving the archival information and artifacts of Clarkdale is part of the Mission of the Historical Society.

This summer, many archival supplies were purchased with funds received through the Arizona Historical Record Advisory Board Grant.

In addition, a \$1,600 grant from the Arizona Historical Record Advisory Board has been awarded to the Historical Society. These funds will be used to hire an intern to inventory the Town of Clarkdale ledgers pertaining to the United Verde Development Co, the United Verde Public Utilities Co., the United Verde Farm and Orchard Co., and the Clarkdale Improvement Co.

The intern will prepare finding aids that will go into AZ Archives On Line and will help researchers and others find materials they need.

Volunteer archivist Carol Lombard will be returning from Alaska this month to help in our collections management program.
